Our project: Quilted Family Portraits

Like Faith Ringgold, we will be making a family portrait that looks like a quilt!

We will select a memory/event/story and write about it. We will then draw a portrait of our family to illustrate the story in the center. The written text and patterns will be the border of the quilt.

We will learn the characteristics of a quilt

Materials: Pencil, paper, colored pencils, and possibly string/needles to sew

We will put all of our “patches” together to form a class quilt and hang it up.

Parts of a Quilt

Block: the square section of a quilt (can be made up of multiple fabric squares)

Border: Fabric strip(s) “framing” the quilt

Sashings: fabric strips/pieces framing individual blocks

Binding: Long, thin fabric strips that are attached to the borders of a quilt.

Corner Square: A square that is sewn to the ends of the top and bottom border before added to quilt.

Cornerstones: A name given to a small block that join the sashing strips together to surround a block or blocks in a quilt top.
